- Much of Turner's work is exhibited in the Tate Gallery and the National Gallery, London















Week 5/6 Practical inspired by shadow and UV LightSculpture - sunprinting

Cyanotype is a photographic printing process that produces a cyan-blue print. Engineers used the process well into the 20th century as a simple and low-cost process to produce copies of drawings, referred to as blueprints. The process uses two chemicals: ammonium iron(III) citrate and potassium ferricyanide.
