Black History Month


Throughout October, all year groups have been exploring and celebrating the achievements and contributions made by black people to art, science, politics, culture and beyond throughout history and today.

Examples of some of the fantastic work the children have been producing is below. We hope they have shared some of this with you at home.



Year 2: Through the month of October, Year 2 have been learning about some important people in history as part of Black History Month. They have produced some fantastic writing






Year 1 have enjoyed learning about Mae Jemison and engaging in






Amongst other activities, Year 4 used Powerpoint to make presentations about a black person who has inspired them
