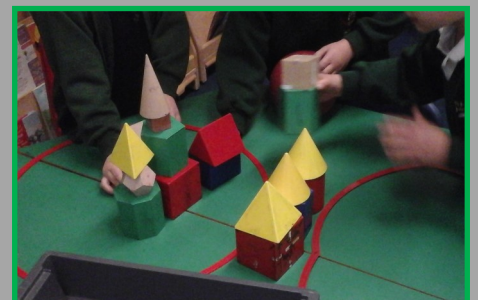

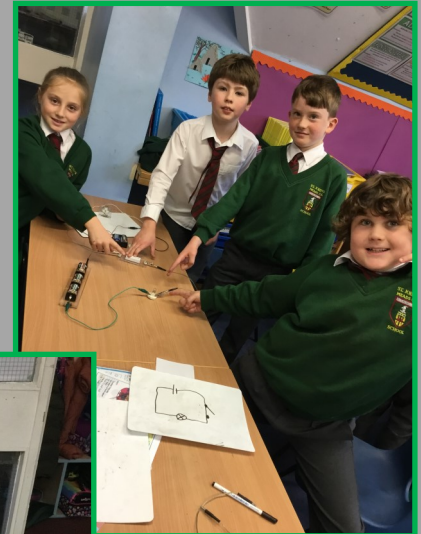
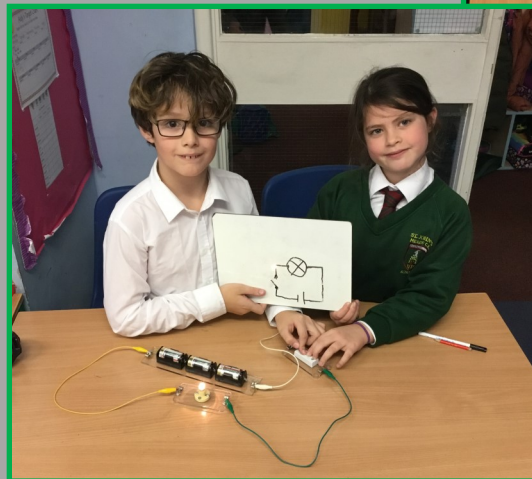
Year 1—Maths

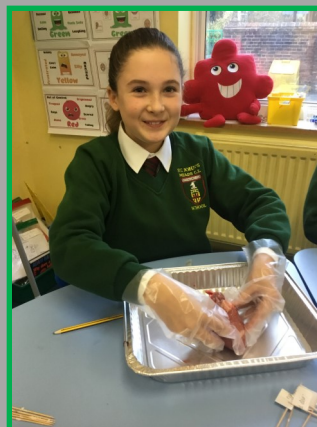
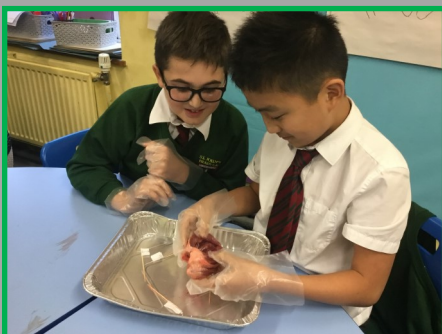


This week, **Year 6** had fun exploring lamb's hearts as part of their learning about the circulatory system. They labelled the different parts and looked inside.
