

EASTBOURNE SPRING WATER FESTIVAL 2022 will run between Friday May 13th and Sunday May 22nd with a wide range of exciting activities and creative opportunities. The TOPIC for this competition is "THE SEA. The closing date for entries is Friday May 13th.

You can respond to "The SEA "in one of 3 ways:

- · Creative writing: story
- Creative writing: poem.

Factual or creative approaches expressed via film.

Although Plastic Free Eastbourne works to protect the environment, entries do not need to have an environmental theme. We are seeking all types of creative response. There is NO minimum or maximum word count. Videos should be NO longer than 10 minutes in length. Each entry including video must be the original work of one entrant although a video entry may feature interviewees or presenters.
