# Evaluation of Impact 2021-2022

#### Key Indicator 1:

93% of children in EYFS engaged with balance ability 25% of children from Year5/6 accessed bike ability



## **Basketball Survey:**

56% of children in Key Stage 2 reported that they use the basketball hoops regularly (at least once a week), with 27 children saying they use it daily.

**Forest School Survey:** 90% of children in Year 5&6 agree or strongly agree that they enjoy Forest School.

All classes took part in weekly outdoor learning, in addition to termly forest school sessions.
