Author Visit – Jacqueline Wilson

What a Joy it was this week to welcome Jacqueline Wilson, children's international best-selling author, to St John's Meads.

Jacqueline arrived first thing, adorned with her beautifully chunky silver rings and cheerful demeanour, ready to meet the children and talk about one of her new books '*The Other Edie Trimmer*', and further enthuse our young learners about writing and what it means to be a successful author.

Jacqueline attended the children in our whole school assembly, where she explained to the children about how she approaches her writing; weaving little things from real life into her books (*including her new puppy Molly!*) but never real people!

Dame (did you know she was a Dame?) Jacqueline Wilson became a Patron for East Sussex Foster Care Association (ESFCA) back in 2012 following her success and poignant highlight of foster care work and children, within her infamous book series 'Tracy Beaker'. Jacqueline has commented that 'I've been involved with foster care associations ever since I wrote my book The Story of Tracy Beaker and I'm always impressed by the care and dedication of foster carers, but I think everyone at ESFCA are the absolute best.'

Afterwards, Jacqueline undertook a brief tour of our lovely school, commenting what a beautiful library space we had and could offer the children. Once in the library she was joined by a selection of well-prepared Year 6 learners, who had come ready with questions they had thought about within their recent English lesson.

Here are some example questions from our brilliant Year 6's : What type of beginnings and endings do you prefer to use for your books? Does it always take a long time to accumulate a good story? What is the most memorable thing from your childhood that stays with you to this day? Do you enjoy your role at the East Sussex Foster Care Association? What inspired you to become a writer? What was your favourite book as a child? Do you ever feel like giving up in the middle of a book? Did you have anyone who convinced you to start your writing career, or someone who helped and supported you, or both?

Finally, Jacqueline finished her visit with a book signing session where, clearly, she had perfected her technique, having undertaken such a task many, many times beforehand. The children from across our year groups had left their favourite Wilson stories, ready for Jacqueline to personalise and sign. What a special treat!

A big THANK YOU to Jacqueline for her time, encouragement and kindness. We loved welcoming you to SJM and look forward to seeing you again very soon.

A huge well done to our Year 6 learners for their great questions and to all of our young learners for their impeccable behaviour (as commented on by Jacqueline!), manners and great questions throughout. What a lovely way to further embed their learning and encourage them to continue to enjoy not only reading, but story-telling too! Keep up the fantastic work. We are very proud of you all.




CHINESE NIGHT Fundraiser
