Out of School Achievements



A message from Mrs Byroo (Interim Headteacher)

Dear parent and Carers,

I would like to use this space as a communication with you. I know much has happened over the past few months and I understand that as parents you are concerned about your child and want to be kept informed. I really do hope you find this weekly communication useful and that it goes some way to let you know how we are doing, reassure you of the work that is going on and dispel some 'untruths' that you may hear.

Year 3s shown much thoughtfulness and empathy: I really think that the best children on the planet are here in St John's! This week the children have shown considerable resilience, especially those whose teachers are unwell and not in schools at the moment. In Year 3, I was taken aback with the thoughtfulness and empathy they showed; they miss their teacher but want him to get better above all else.

PGL trip for Year 6: I am grateful to Mrs Martin-O'Donoghue (Senior Education Leader) for DCAT and Mrs Onuzi for all their efforts in making sure we can go ahead with the PGL trip for Year 6. The students are buzzing with all the plans for their residential trip and I know the parents we met today are also looking forward to a bit of a break while their children are meaningfully occupied next weekend...

Hamper from the Community of St John's church: I was also touched by the kindness and generosity of the community at St John's church. As a token of their gratitude for the work we do, they sent in a large hamper with all sorts of treats and cards with such kind supportive messages. I admit I did partake in the 'blessings' in the shape of chocolate and biscuits a bit too much...

The big clear out: This week the skip has been filled for the second time as the staff are working to declutter the school. 
