Class Worship Areas

Each classroom has a Christian worship area, which is added to regularly as part of classroom learning and reflection. They are spaces where the children can come and ponder, ask questions, reflect and pray. These worship areas are accessible and inclusive to all.

They include age-appropriate Bibles, prayer books, a cross, candle and other helpful resources and artefacts to engage the children in thought and prayer. The children will also have a chance to bring in seasonal items to spark curiosity / awe and wonder e.g. natural seasonal items, like conkers/pine cones...

The worship areas will follow the same theme as collective worship that is planned and delivered with our friends at St John's Meads church.

This enables the children to deepen their understanding and thoughts behind each Christian message. This is then continued with the teacher the next day with the children getting the chance to discuss as a class and carry out further learning activities around the message.

Some of the messages we have had this term are:

"Blessed are the Peacemakers" (Matthew 5:1-10) Value: PEACE.

Jesus taught that God blesses those who show kindness and generosity, despite facing difficulties and hardships. He talked about those who work to make peace and said they would be called children of God. In a world full of injustice, unfairness and war how can we be peacemakers?

"Forgive Others" (Matthew 18:21-22) Value: COMMUNITY.

Forgiveness can be hard, especially when feelings have been badly hurt but it's the best way to make things better and mend relationships. Jesus says we need to go on forgiving and even more radically, he says in Matthew 5:39 that we are to repay evil with good.

It would be lovely for you to talk to your child about what happens in worship as they really do enjoy the singing and actively engage with the biblical messages that are shared each week.
