Dear Parents and Carers,

The start of the term has been a good one especially with the days being longer and increasing sunshine. You may have heard all about it by now but in case you have not...

World Book Day was a huge success! A big **Thank you** to Miss Dixon for leading us through it. It has been my best day at St John's so far and I think dressing as Cruella De Vil not only engaged the children - it also caused great amusement to parents when I greeted them in full costume on the gate. There was fierce competition between staff as well as they tried to outdo each other in the Decorate your Door competition. In the end, years 6 & 2 emerged as the winners. As a result of everyone's efforts, we had some time on the field this afternoon. The children enjoyed this rare treat despite it starting to rain just as we got there! There are very few things that are a better sight than watching children play. However, I do have to apologise for the muddy clothes - luckily you have the weekend to get it sorted.

Feedback

We have had a few visitors in recently and they have shared some really positive feedback. We had 3 exstudents come back for their work experience and a colleague from the secondary school came in to check in on them. This is an extract of what she shared with us, and we all thought it was really lovely and captures what this school is about.

Dear Ms Byroo,

... it was such a positive visit; I thought it worth sharing some of what the students said as it really resonated with me. They all spoke of how much they have taken from the placement and how much opportunity they have been given to grow their skills. They were incredibly grateful for the work the staff at the school had put into helping them thrive and also for the way the school had embraced them. All three students were keen to look for further opportunities around how they can continue to work with young people, which I have passed onto our Careers team. One insight that struck me was their recognition of being in a workplace where you are valued as a key part of a team. In the short time I was in the school, I certainly got a sense of this from every interaction with both staff and students..

As humans we know how good it feels when you get positive feedback. So many of the parents/Carers of St John's give us good feedback at every chance they get, and I want you to know how that helps us to keep going.

However, it has been brought to my attention by a few parents that the Whatsapp groups and conversations on the playground can sometimes fuel negativity that is unhelpful and unnecessary. We are a Christian school community with children at the centre of all we do. In the same spirit can I please urge you to be supportive of each other, and us, so that the children can get the best from their school.

If there is a need to voice your dissatisfaction or bring something to our attention - please do so through the correct channels - with teachers/members of staff directly. Every member of staff, child and family is valued and loved here at St. John's Meads.

Supporting Friendships and Addressing Bullying in Worship

This week in worship, we explored the importance of friendships and how to recognize and respond to bullying.

The children actively engaged in discussions and shared wonderful ideas about what makes a good friend—being kind, playing together, being trustworthy, making each other laugh, and listening.

We talked about what bullying means, explaining that it happens when someone hurts, frightens, or upsets another person on purpose and repeatedly. To help the children feel empowered to take action, we introduced the acronym **STOP – Start Telling Other People** as a way to encourage them to seek help if they ever witness or experience bullying.

We also emphasized the importance of using **kind hands**, **kind feet**, **and kind voices** in all their interactions. It was heartening to hear

the children confidently identify what they would do if they encountered bullying, including naming five trusted adults they could turn to for support.

By reinforcing these values at home, we can continue to nurture a school community where kindness and respect flourish.

Highlights from Year 3

In maths, the children have been exploring the concept of measurement in a creative way - using non-standard units to measure objects around the classroom.

Instead of rulers and tape measures, they used counters and even their hands to estimate and measure lengths.







This hands-on approach has helped them develop a deeper understanding of size, comparison, and the importance of consistency in measurement, all while having fun with everyday objects!



In PE, students have been working on their hand-eye coordination by practicing with rackets and balls. Through a variety of engaging activities, they have been learning to control the ball and improve their accuracy. One of the highlights was when students rallied with themselves, bouncing the ball against the ground or wall before returning it with their racket. This allowed them to focus on their technique and build confidence in their skills.

It's been fantastic to see them improving in both coordination and concentration!

In science this week, the children created circuits to test how adding more batteries makes the bulb brighter.



In history, we have been learning about the Battle of Britain and enjoyed drawing different planes as part of our 'Award winning' door display on World Book Day!






