Dear Parents and Carers.

This final week has been filled with lots of creativity. The children worked on Food and Nutrition as part of the DT curriculum. Tasty sandwiches were made and promptly wolfed down in Year 3, while Year 1 loved making fruit salad. Year 5 scaled it up by making bread. Not only was this good fun but it also plays a big part in developing lifelong skills, using equipment safely and most importantly being able to feed yourself!

I was particularly impressed by Reception in their RE lesson this week. They have been learning all about the Easter story with several elements that work together to develop a range of skills. I have never heard the Easter story told with such enthusiasm and fervour- complete with actions of the boulder being rolled away.

We had an external auditor visit to assess our Safeguarding processes and she compiled a report that was pleasing to read. The staff at St John's continue to ensure that our school is a safe and happy place and this is further evidence of that.





'The wellbeing and care of every pupil is at the fore front of all aspects of school life at St John's Meads. A calm and safe atmosphere pervades the school, as does the school's Christian values and ethos and underpins the school's decision making, as evidenced in the 2017 SIAMs report.'

Student voice was also part of the review and this is what was reported: The change from the 'rainbow approach' to the zones of regulation and the new school 'Light' values are significantly improving pupils attitudes to learning, love of school and inter-personal relationships. In a short space of time it has become embedded in the culture of behaviour management. Pupils are able to describe the new approach in detail, and were very positive about the changes.

I think back rather wistfully to the Easter holidays when my boys were younger. I recall lots of lovely walks in the sun in our beautiful surroundings and plenty of Easter eggs.




