Term 5 has started well with the children looking smart and much cooler in their summer uniform and just in time too!

Class Updates

The Year 1 class were off with a Bang with their space theme, and I love that Mr Barber and Mrs Vile were dressed as astronauts in modified Hazmat suits to add authenticity to the day. It is encouraging to see how the children have developed their writing on the theme of space; they have been sharing such great ideas and are now including direct speech in their work.



Year 6 continue to impress as they apply themselves to their work with high levels of engagement and perseverance. Mrs Foster, Mrs White, Mrs Capon and Mrs Miller are working well to keep them on track, and we know that the children will do their best in the SATS in the week of the 12th of May.

We have had successful trips in Year 2 and 4; all the children were commended on their excellent behaviour. They enjoyed these enriching experiences, and we are grateful to the staff and parents who make this possible. Year 4 continued their learning after their visit; report writing on their trip to Battle Abbey. They impressed us with their extensive vocabulary and the great pride they took in editing and presenting their work.

Year 5 were all awarded the Headteachers Award this week, for consistent effort. They have all really improved the range of vocabulary and punctuation in their writing. They are all showing great independence in their ability to stay on task.



Year 3 have been developing their writing in English using the book Ratty's Big ADVENTURE ADVENTURE. They are now learning about direct speech and punctuating it correctly. They used their imagination to introduce their own characters into the story, ranging from leopards to lemurs. We are particularly pleased that they are working independently for longer periods of time and starting to edit their work.

In Reception the children are coming along in leaps and bounds. Mrs Satchell, Mrs Pillar and Mrs Grout have been carrying out assessments and it is truly remarkable to see just how secure they are becoming in a range of skills such as their reading, language and even social skills.



The Green Team has been newly formed; this is a group of children who wish to get more involved in making a difference to our local environment. We are excited about this - for now the children want to claim back the allotment on the field and organise a beach clean in the last term. We will keep you posted as this develops as we may need some support to get the allotments ready for the children to do some planting. 
