

Highlights from this term

This term, **Year 5** have been embracing their artistic side with a project inspired by the natural world.

The children began their creative journey with a walk-in nature, where they observed and sketched leaves, trees and other

natural forms that caught their attention.

Back in the classroom, these sketches became the foundation for a printmaking project. The children carefully carved their designs into printing blocks, then used ink to bring their nature-inspired artwork to life.





The final prints were truly beautiful, showing a wonderful mix of detail, imagination and creativity. It has been a fantastic experience that combined time outdoors with artistic learning, and we are very proud of all the pupils for their hard work and enthusiasm.



Year 5 also enjoyed some different activities this week; Bikeability and DCAT enriched, where 20 children learned a choreographed dance to 'Summer Nights' and had their voices recorded singing the song. We are really looking forward to practising and then performing along with all the other schools in the Diocese Academy Trust at Hurstpierpoint College. Well done, Year 5!



Year 4 have been making Greek salads this week as part of their DT lessons.

The children enjoyed exploring the ingredients, experiencing the various smells and textures. The children eagerly tried a variety of new vegetables—onions were a particular hit!

Even some of the parents have had the chance to try the salads and have given fantastic feedback, commenting on how delicious they were.



Reception have enjoyed visits from the fire service and a dentist as part of our topic about 'People who help us'.

We learnt all about how to look after our teeth and gums from the dentist and the children really enjoyed looking inside the fire engine, squirting the hose and finding out about the special equipment that fire fighters use.

In RE we have been thinking about what makes us precious and unique.




This term, **Year 3** has been focusing on both teamwork and individual responsibility through a fun and challenging relay activity.

In Science we have been focusing on plants and their different parts as well as explaining the job that each part plays in helping the plant to grow.

We explored the field and found real life examples of the parts of a plant before creating and labelling our very own in the classroom.



We have also been visited by some feathered friends who have finally discovered our bird feeder. We have affectionately named them 'Charlie the Jackdaw' and 'Sprinkles the Magpie'. It has been wonderful to see the children's excitement and awe each and every time the birds appear at our window.



We have also had some fantastic Maths, practicing describing direction and turns, using the correct vocabulary to direct each other to the treasure, as well as practicing splitting amounts into equal groups. Although it has been a short term it has certainly been a brilliant one.



Year 6 have had a brilliant term working incredibly hard towards their SATs.


As a school, we are so proud of their effort and focus during this important week.

We enjoyed our trip this week for 'Safety in Action' where the children met local emergency service workers and learnt about keeping themselves safe as their independence grows.






One more term to go and we've got lots of exciting things planned.


